

A catalog of the types of Fulgoromorpha, Cicadomorpha and Sternorrhyncha (Insecta, Hemiptera) deposited in the Museo Argentino de Ciencias Naturales, Buenos Aires

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Abstract: The type specimens (all current categories) of sixty-nine names in Fulgoromorpha, Cicadomorpha and Sternorrhyncha housed in this Museum are listed. In order to assist future research, two lists are added: 1. of specimens labeled as types of names not found in the bibliography, and probably not published, and 2. of specimens labeled as types but not included in the original publications, published thereafter or not.

Key words: Type specimens, Insecta, Hemiptera, Fulgoromorpha, Cicadomorpha, Sternorrhyncha.

Resumen: Catálogo de los tipos de Fulgoromorpha, Cicadomorpha y Sternorrhyncha (Insecta, Hemiptera) depositados en el Museo Argentino de Ciencias Naturales, Buenos Aires. Se catalogan los ejemplares tipo (todas las categorías aceptadas) de sesenta y nueve nombres de Fulgoromorpha, Cicadomorpha y Sternorrhyncha conservados en este Museo. Para facilitar futuras investigaciones, se agregan dos listas: 1. de ejemplares rotulados como tipos, de nombres no hallados en la bibliografía, y probablemente no publicados, y 2. de ejemplares rotulados como tipos, pero no incluidos en la publicación original, y publicados después, o no.

Palabras clave: Ejemplares tipo, Insecta, Hemiptera, Fulgoromorpha, Cicadomorpha, Sternorrhyncha.

INTRODUCTION

A catalog of the type specimens (all current categories) of species of Homoptera housed in the Entomological Division of this Museum is presented, referred to sixty-nine names. The specific and subspecific epithets are alphabetically filed in a single list, followed by the generic ones, in their original spellings. A brief bibliographic quoting is given, as well as a list of specimens examined, if these were mentioned. An account of the types actually here housed follows, with description of all their labels. Later nomenclatural and taxonomic changes are added, insofar these are known by the author. When no name-bearing type, or an equivalent was designated, nor the amount of specimens examined was stated, it is assumed that there was a series of syntypes (eventually a “sole syntype”) (Recommendation 73 F of the International Code of Zoological Nomenclature, 1999). In geographical mentions, if the country is not mentioned, Argentina is meant.

Some specimens in the collection are labeled

as types of names not found in the bibliography, and assumed not to have been published; such names are probably not available in the sense of the Code; however, in order to assist future research, they are separately listed. Specimens labeled as types, but not mentioned in the original publication, published thereafter or not, conform a further separate list. Specimens labeled as types, but not intended as types, are not acceptable; however, also in order to assist future research, one is included under a third heading [*Taracticus chilensis* (Spinola) Berg].

At his death in 1892, Hermann Burmeister was followed by Carlos Berg as the Director of the Museo Público de Buenos Aires, now Museo Argentino de Ciencias Naturales, this Museum; Berg increased (chiefly with Lepidoptera, Hemiptera and Coleoptera) the entomological collection started by Burmeister, and held another collection at the University of Buenos Aires; this one was transferred by 1970 to the Museum. Burmeister did not label each specimen; instead he fastened to the bottom of the drawer, in front

of each specific series, handwritten labels with the names of genus and/or species, sometimes with a vague geographic reference, like “Rep. Arg.” for Argentina or “Patag.” for Patagonia; his “types” are not identified (nor designated in the publications), and therefore only hardly recognisable. Specimens of Burmeister’s collection are frequently identified with a label reading “Colección Antigua” (Ancient Collection), as they conformed the basis of the entomological collection of the Museum.

Carlos Berg used to attach to his pinned types tiny, red framed labels with “Typus” printed in red. The collection of Jean Brèthes was deposited long ago in this Museum.

After the decease of Everard E. Blanchard, his family donated to the Museum his library and his collection, chiefly Diptera and Hymenoptera, but also rich in Aphids.

CATALOG OF THE TYPES

Fulgoromorpha

acutiusculus [*Idiosystatus*, Delphacidae] Berg 1883: 232–233. Patagonia [Santa Cruz Prov.]; Santa Cruz Stream 9.X.1874, **two ♀**. Could be *Delphax acutiusculus* Spinola, or another genus. **One synt.** on a card, “16” print. on green paper;

“Typus” print. with red ink, red frame; “S.Cruz / Patag.” print. on green paper; “*Idiosystatus / acutiusculus* / Berg / (?Spin.)” handwr., red frame.

australis [*Lacertina*, Delphacidae] Remes Lenicov & Rossi Batiz, *in Rossi Batiz & Remes Lenicov 2011: 64–67, f. 1–5*. Buenos Aires Prov.: City Bell, **holot.** ♂ in **MLP**, **parat.** *idem*; Poblet; Córdoba Prov: Huerta Grande in **MLP**. **Two parat.** City Bell, ♂, ♀ in **MACN**. Other spec. from several prov.

Two parat. on pointed cards, on separate pins, “City Bell; La Plata, Bs As / 26/I/08/ Rossi Batiz col / s/Cortaderia sp.” print. on white paper, black frame; “*Lacertina/australis PARATYPUS*” handwr. on yellow paper, black frame; “*Lacertinella / australis / (Remes Lenicov & Rossi Batiz)*” print. on white paper, black frame.

Note: *Lacertina* Remes Lenicov & Rossi Batiz 2011 is a homonym of *Lacertina* Meuschen 1776. Remes Lenicov & Rossi Batiz (*Zootaxa*, in press) propose *Lacertinella* as a replacement name.

distanti (*sub Distanti*) [*Plagiopsis*, Issidae] Berg 1883: 191. Buenos Aires Prov.: Chacabuco, leg. F. Lynch Arribálzaga. **One ♂** in Museo Público (=MACN); **one ♀**, **one “pseudoimago”** in CB [in MACN].

One synt. on a card, “Typus” print. with red ink, red frame; “Chacab. / F. Lynch” print. with red ink, red frame; “*Plagiopsis / Distanti* Berg” handwr., red frame.

lyra [*Falcidius*, Issidae] Berg 1883: 238–239. Entre Ríos Prov.: Concepción del Uruguay, Doering leg., ♂, ♀ in Museo Público (=MACN); B. Aires leg. Reich, **two spec.** in **MB**.

One synt. on a card, left wings missing, “Typus” print. with red ink, red frame; “*Uru / guay*” print. on green paper; “*Falcidius / lyra* (Brm.) / Berg” handwr., red frame.

Note: Uruguay refers very probably to the city Concepción del Uruguay.

mitrii (*sub Mitrii*) [*Fulgora*, Fulgoridae] Burmeister 1867: 23–24. Paraguay.

One synt. pinned, wings extended, “Col. / Antigua” print. on whitish paper, black frame; “*Fulgora / aut.*”, “*lucifera / Gue / Mitrii* Burm. / Paraguay” handwr. by Burmeister, black frame, originally fastened to the bottom of the drawer.

sensitivus [*Notolathrus*, Cixiidae] Remes Lenicov 1992: 158–159, f. 1–9. Neuquén Prov.:

Departm. Picunches: Cave of the Arenal (Cuchillo Cura), **holot.** ♂, **two parat.** ♂ in **MACN**.

Holot. in a plastic microvial with liquid preservative, contained in a bigger plastic vial with liquid, “Notolathrus / sensitivus / n. sp. / Neuquen” handwr. with pencil?, glued to the bigger vial; “Holotipo” and “Tipo” print. on white paper, black frame; “Notolathrus / sensitivus / Remes Lenicov” handwr. with pencil? on white paper; “Caverna del Arenal / Cuchillo Cura / Las Lajas / Neuquen [handwr. wth pencil] / Museo Argentino de Ciencias Naturales [print.]” on white paper, black frame.

Cicadomorpha

araucanus [*Athysanus*, Euscelidae] Berg 1881: 267–268. Chile: Valdivia and Lota II.1879, **two** ♀. Type in author’s coll. [CB, in MACN].

One synt. on a card, “Typus” print. with red ink, red frame; “Valdivia / C. Berg” handwr., red frame; “Athysanus / araucanus / Berg” handwr., red frame; “Athysanus Burm.”, “arauacanus Berg”, handwr. by Berg, black frame, originally fastened to the bottom of the drawer. **One synt.** pinned, tip of pin broken, “Typus” print. with red ink, red frame; “Lota / C. Berg” print. with red ink, red frame; “Athysanus / araucanus / Berg” print with red ink, red frame.

Notes: Recorded as *Athysanus araucanus* by Metcalf (1967: 349) and McKamey (2002).

bahiensis [*Tettigades*, Cicadidae] Torres 1942: 256–257, f. 2: 1–3. Buenos Aires Prov.: Bahía Blanca. **Allot.** (pro Holot.?) ♂, **two parat.** ♂ in **MACN**:

bahiensis [*Alarcta*]: Torres 1958a: 25–26, pl. 1: f. 5, pl. 3: f. 1, 5, pl. 5: f. 1. *Nov. combin.*

Holot.?, **two parat.** pinned, holot.? and one parat. with left wings extended, the other parat. with all four wings extended, “Bs. Aires [print.] / Bahia / Blanca [handwr.]” on green paper, black frame, reverse white; “Exc. / E. Gemignani” handwr.; “51443” handwr., black frame; “Museo de La Plata/Holotipo [Paratipo, Paratipo] [print.] / Tettigades / bahiensis / Torres [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame; “Museo de La Plata [print.] / Alarcta / bahiensis / (Torres) / Det. B.A. Torres [handwr.]” on white paper, black frame.

Notes: Transferred to *Alarcta* by Torres (1958a: 25–26). The word “Alotipo” in the original publication is puzzling, it is probably a print error for “Holotipo”; the label on the spec. reads ‘Holotipo’.

bicolor [*Guaranisaria*, Cicadidae] Torres 1958c: 23–26, f. 3c, 4. Misiones Prov.: Pindapoy, **holot.** ♂ in **MLP**. Misiones Prov.: Dep. Concepción: Santa María, **allot.** ♀ in **MACN**. **Parat.** ♂, ♀ *idem*.

Allot. pinned, all four wings extended, “Misiones - Argentina / Dep. Concepción - Sta. María / M.J. Viana” print., remains of a black frame; “48044” handwr., red frame; “Museo de La Plata / Alotipo [print.] / Guaranisaria / bicolor / Torres [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame; “M.B. Riv.” handwr.

bosqi [*Tettigades*, Cicadidae] Torres 1942: 258–259, f. 3: 1–3. Mendoza, leg. Lizer, **holot.** ♀, **seven** ♀ **parat.** in **MACN**, **allot.** ♂ in **MLP**.

Five parat. pinned, **four of them** with left wings extended, **one of them** with right wings extended, “Cacheuta” handwr. on green paper, black frame, reverse white; “7844” handwr., red frame; “Museo de La Plata / Paratipo [print.] / Tettigades / bosqi / Torres [handwr.]” on red paper, red frame. **Four of them**, also “Cacheuta / Mendoza Arg. / Spegazzini leg.” handwr. on white paper.

Note: Holot. and two parat. not found.

chacoana [*Ceresa*, Membracidae] Remes Lenicov 1973b: 111–113, pl. xxii: f. 159–167. Misiones Prov.: Concepción, **holot.** ♂, **allot.** ♀, **parat.** **four** ♂, **two** ♀ in **MACN**. Chaco Prov.: Basii [sic, pro Basail?]; Neuquen Prov.: Catandil [sic, pro Catan Lil?]; Brasil, all in **MLP**.

Two parat. on cards, “Misiones-Argentina / Dep. Concep.-Sta. María / M.J. Viana [print.] X-1944 [X-1947] [handwr.]”, remains of a black frame.

One parat. on a card “Argentina-Misiones [print.] / Dto. Guaraní [handwr.] / M.J. Viana [print.] X.1942 [handwr., obverse, with remains of a black frame] / El Soberbio [handwr., reverse]”.

All three: “Museo de La Plata / Paratipo [print.] / Ceresa / chacoana Remes- / Lenicov 1971 [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame.

Note: Holot., allot., one parat. not found.

crassicauda [*Carineta*, Cicadidae] Torres 1948a: 125–127, f. 6. **Holot.** ♂, **allot.** ♀ Catamarca, Schaefer, in **MLP**. **Parat.** Catamarca Prov: Queñoa Pelado, in **IFML**; Tucumán Prov.: Tafí del Valle in **IFML**; Salta Prov. in **MACN**.

One parat. pinned, left wings extended; “5653” handwr., red frame; “Rep. Argentina / Prov. Salta / 31.I.1897 / S. Venturi” print., date handwr., black frame.

fasciatithorax [*Ceresa*, Membracidae] Remes Lenicov 1973b: 119–121, pl. XXV: f. 186–194. Bolivia, **holot.** ♂, **allot.** ♀, in MACN.

Allot. on a pointed card, a glass microvial with dissected parts, “Bolivia” handwr. on green paper, black frame, reverse white; “♀” print.; “11862” handwr., red frame; “Museo de La Plata / Alotipo [print.] / Ceresa / fasciatithorax / Remes Lenicov ‘71 [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame.

Note: Holot. not found.

gibbosa [*Taunaya*, Membracidae] Remes Lenicov 1973a: 137–139, f. 1–3. Misiones Prov.: Concepción Dep.: Santa María XI-1956, Viana leg. **Holot.** ♀, **parat.** two ♀, in MACN.

One parat. on a pointed card, “Misiones. Argentina / Dto. Concepción / Sta. María / Viana leg.” handwr., black frame; “Museo de La Plata / Paratipo [print.] / Taunaya / gibbosa Remes / Lenicov 1972 [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame.

Note: Holot. and one parat. are housed in MLP, the MACN as the repository is a *lapsus* in the publication, *fide* Remes Lenicov (personal communication via e-mail II.2011).

grandis [*Psephenotettix*, Cicadidae] Torres 1958d: 37–40, f. 7–12, 14. Salta, **holot.** ♂ in MLP. Salta Prov: Molinos, **allot.** ♀ in IFML. **Parat.** *idem*, Catamarca Prov: Condorhuasi, in IFML. Mendoza Prov., leg. Reed, in MLP. San Juan Prov., leg. Berg, in MLP. San Juan Prov.: Mediagua, leg. Zotta & Aiello, in MACN.

One parat. pinned, left wings extended, “51631” handwr., black frame; “Argentina [print.] / Mediagua [handwr.] / San Juan [print.]” black frame; “A. Zotta y / A.N. Aiello leg.” handwr., remains of a black frame; “Museo de La Plata / Paratipo [print.] / Psephenotetttix / grandis / Torres [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame; “M.B. Riv.” handwr.

insularis [*Agallia*, Jassidae] Berg 1884: 39–40. Tierra del Fuego: Staaten Is., leg. Spegazzini II.1882, **some spec.**

Three synt. on pointed cards, on separate pins, “Typus” print. in red, red frame: “Tierra / D. Fuego” handwr. on green paper, black frame; “2155” handwr., red frame; “Agallia / insularis / Berg” copied by me from labels originally fastened to the bottom of the drawer.

Notes: Recorded as *Agallia insularis* by Metcalf (1966: 38) and McKamey (2002). Currently in Agalliidae.

macrogina [*Tettigades*, Cicadidae] Torres 1949: 184–187, f. 3–4, pl. 1: f. 3. Pampa Central, **holot.** ♀ in MACN.

macrogina [*Alarcta*]: Torres 1958b: 31–32. Pampa Central. *Nov. combin.*

Holot. pinned, all four wings extended, “Pampa Central / E. Caride leg.” handwr.; “6649” handwr., red frame; “Museo de La Plata / Holotipo [print.] / Tettigades / macrogina / Torres [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame; “Museo de La Plata [print.] / Alarcta / macrogina / (Torres) / Det. B.A. Torres [handwr.]” on white paper, black frame.

Notes: Transferred to *Alarcta* by Torres (1958a: 31–32). Pampa Central refers broadly to La Pampa Prov.

maculata [*Tettigotoma*, Cicadidae] Torres 1942: 254–256, f. 1: 1–3, Pampa Central “**alot.** ♂” (*sic, pro holot.*) in MACN.

Holot. pinned, left wings extended, “6649” handwr., red frame; “Ppa Ctl” stamped; “Museo de La Plata / Holotipo [print.] / Tettigotoma / maculata / Torres [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame.

Notes: Torres (1948b) described a female, not mentioned in the original description, and unduly labeled it “Alotipo”. Pampa Central refers broadly to La Pampa Prov.

major [*Tettigades*, Cicadidae] Torres 1944: 467–469, f. 5: a–d, pl. 5. Several “**cotypes**”, Río Negro Prov: San Antonio, leg. Carcelles, in MACN; some without locality label.

One synt. pinned, with left wings extended, “San Antonio Rio / Negro. A. Carcelles / leg.” handwr. **One synt.** pinned, with all four wings extended, without locality label. **Both:** “12730” handwr.; “Museo de La Plata / Cotipo [print.] / Tettigades / major / Torres [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame.

minuta [*Tettigades*, Cicadidae] Torres 1949: 187–189, f. 5, 6, pl. 1: 2. Pampa Central. **Holot.** ♀ in MACN.

minuta [*Alarcta*]: Torres 1958a: 32–33. *Nov. combin.*

Holot. pinned, all four wings extended, “Pampa Central / E. Caride Leg.” handwr.; “6649” handwr., red frame; “Museo de La Plata / Holotipo [print.] / Tettigades / minuta / Torres [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame; “Alarcta / minuta / (Torres) / Det. B.A. Torres [handwr.]” on white paper, black frame.

Notes: Transferred to *Alarcta* by Torres (1958a: 32–33). Pampa Central refers broadly to La Pampa Prov.

nigripectus [Ceresa, Membracidae] Remes Lenicov 1973b: 80–82, pl. IX: f. 58–66. Santiago del Estero Prov.: Chilca, **holot.** ♂; **parat.** Salta Prov.: between Galpón and Trancas, **allot.** ♀. Other **parat.** from Córdoba Prov.: Bajo Grande; Santa Fe Prov.: Candioti; Formosa Prov.: Togo, and Las Palmas; Jujuy Prov.: Palpalá; Salta Prov.: Metán; Misiones Prov.: Concepción; San Juan Prov.; Tucumán Prov.; Buenos Aires Prov.: Junín.

Two parat. on pointed cards, “Chilca Sgo. del / Estero / 7.IV.945 / Col. H. Maldonado” handwr., black frame; “Museo de La Plata / Paratipo [print.] / Ceresa / nigripectus Remes / Lenicov 1971 [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame.

Note: The specific epithets on the publication and on the labels differ slightly, *nigripectus* against *nigropectus*, but the labels are authentic.

pauxilla [Tettigades, Cicadidae] Torres 1958b: 66–67, pl. 3: f. 6–9; pl. 11: f. 2; pl. 19: f. 6. Chile: Cura Cautin, **holot.** ♂ in MLP. Chile: Victoria, **parat.** in BM and MACN. “Otro material estudiado” without locality labels, in MACN.

One parat. pinned, all four wings extended, “10048” handwr., red frame; “Chile” handwr. on green paper, black frame, reverse white; a circle of green paper; “Museo de La Plata / Paratipo [print.] / Tettigades / pauxilla / Torres [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame.

Note: There is another spec. with a circle of green paper, but without parat. label, “Museo de La Plata [print.] / Tettigades / pauxilla / Torres / Det. B.A. Torres [handwr.]” on white paper, black frame. See the third list, below.

peruensis [Ceresa, Membracidae] Remes Lenicov 1973b: 82–85, pl. x: f. 67–75. Perú: Chanchamayo Valley, **holot.** ♂, **allot.** ♀. Perú: Tingo María. Bolivia: Nor Yungas Prov.: Caranavi; Santa Cruz. Brasil: Amazonas: Rio Preto, **parat.**

One parat. on a pointed card, a glass microvial with dissected parts, “Bolivia” handwr. on green paper, black frame, reverse white; “11862” handwr., red frame; “Museo de La Plata / Paratipo [print.] / Ceresa / peruensis Remes Lenicov / 1971 [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame.

porteri (sub **Porteri**) [Tettigades, Cicadidae] Brèthes 1920: 10. Chile: Lonquimay, ♀ in MACN.

opaca [Tettigades]: Jacobi 1907: 27.

opaca [Tettigades]: Torres 1958b: 60–61. Designates the ♀ holot. of *T. porteri* Brèthes as allot. of *T. opaca* Jacobi; see at the *Note*, below.

Holot. pinned, all four wings extended, “Lonquimay / Curacautin / Porter / I.1917” handwr.; “type!” handwr.; “Tettigades / Porteri Brèthes” handwr.; “Museo de La Plata / Alotipo [print.] / Tettigades / opaca Jac. / Det. B.A. Torres” handwr. on red paper, black frame.

Note: Torres (1958b: 60–61) accepted the synonymy of *Tettigades porteri* with *T. opaca*, and unduly designated the ♀ holot. of *T. porteri* as the allot. of *T. opaca*.

praegracilis [Proarna, Cicadidae] Berg 1881: 264. Bolivia “El Museo Público [= MACN] posee un ejemplar de esta especie” [The Museo Público (=MACN) owns a specimen of this species].

One synt.? pinned, right wings missing, “S. Cruz. Boliv.”, “Proarna praegracilis”, “Typus”, “♀” all handwr.

Note: It is not clear if the spec. mentioned as being in the MACN, is the type.

proxima [Smiliorhachis, Membracidae] Berg 1883: 292–293. Uruguay, November, on *Acacia farnesiana*, **many spec.** of both sexes.

Two synt. pinned on one pin, “Typus” print. in red, red frame; “Banda / Orienta” print. on green paper; “Smiliorha / chis / Fairm. /1846” and “proxima / B. O. Berg”, handwr. by Berg, black frame, both originally fastened to the bottom of the drawer.

Note: Banda Oriental is an old name of Uruguay.

stelliger [Athysanus, Cicadellidae] Berg 1884: 29–30. Buenos Aires, **many** ♂, ♀ at artificial light.

One synt. on a card, “Athysanus / stelliger / Berg” handwr., red frame, “Burm.” handwr.; “Typus” print. with red ink, red frame.

Notes: Recorded as *Graminella stelliger* by Linnauvori (1959). “Holotype”, “allotype” and two “paratypes” (all of which should be considered as synt.) are housed in MLP (Paradell, Dellapé & Catalano 2008: 40). Currently in Euscelidae.

stylata [Ceresa, Membracidae] Remes Lenicov 1973b: 74–77. pl. VII: 41–48. Misiones Prov.: Concepción, **holot.** ♂ in MACN. Misiones Prov.: Santa Inés, **allot.** Buenos Aires Prov.: Sierra de la Ventana, **parat.** Bolivia: Santa Cruz, **parat.**

Holot. on a card, a glass microvial with dissected parts, “Misiones - Argentina / Dep. Concep. - Sta. María / X-1941. M.J.Viana” print., date handwr., remains of a black frame; “Museo de La Plata / Holotipo [print.] / Ceresa / stylata Remes Lenicov / 1971 [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame.

Two slides, with 1+2 **synt.**, “*Macrosiphum / lizerianum, / Blanchard*” handwr., red frame; “*s/ Aster sp. / S. Isidro / 24-III-1919*” handwr. with ink on the glass, one of them also “*Syntype*”. In slide coll. under M”22, M”23.

Note: Gral. Urquiza is a district in Buenos Aires City.

paraguaricensis [*Pendularia*] Granara de Willink 1999: 129–131, f. 51. Misiones Prov.: Posadas, on *Ilex paraguariensis*, **holot.**, **eight parat.**, in **MACN, USNM, IFML**.

Note: Not published, *fide* Nieto Nafría *in litt.* 17.III.2000, and e-mail VI 2011. He remounted the spec. on fifteen slides. A synonym of *Aphis gossypi*. *fide* Nieto Nafría, personal communication (*in litt.*, e-mail VIII.2011).

platensis [*Ceroplastes*] Brèthes

Two slides, “*Ceroplastes/platensis* Br. [Brèthes] / sur *Ilex aquifolium* / BsAs 31.VII.917” handwr. by Brèthes. In slide coll. under C15, C16.

Specimens labeled as types but not conforming a type series**Cicadomorpha**

pauxilla [*Tettigades*, Cicadidae] Torres 1958b: 66–67, pl. 3: f. 6–9; pl. 11: f. 2; pl. 19: f. 6. Chile: Cura Cautin, **holot.** ♂ in MLP. Chile: Victoria, **parat.** in BM and MACN. “Otro material estudiado”, without locality label, in MACN.

One spec. pinned, all four wings extended, “10048” handwr., red frame; “Chile” handwr. on green paper, black frame, reverse white; a circle of green paper; “Museo de La Plata [print.] / Tettigades / pauxilla / Torres [handwr.]” on red paper, black frame. “Museo de La Plata / Tettigades / pauxilla / Torres / Det. B.A. Torres [handwr.]” on white paper, black frame. a circle of green paper,

Notes: The spec. bears no type label, it is perhaps detached, or omitted. The type condition is dubious. See for one parat. in the main list, above.

bonariensis [*Macrosiphoniella*]: Blanchard 1932: 19–21, f. 1. Buenos Aires 17.VI.1929, on cultivated *Pyrethrum*. Specific rank.

bonariensis [*Macrosiphoniella tanacetaria* subsp.]: Seco Fernández, Ortego, Mier Durante & Nieto Nafría 2000: 159–160. As a subspecies; a synonym of *M. tanacetaria italicica*; only spec. of 1932 were seen, the types of 1922 were not seen.

Two original slides with **synt.** “s/*Pyrethrum* sp. / Cap. Federal / 17-VI-1929”, “*Macrosiphum* [*Macrosiphoniella*] / *bonariensis* / Blnch. [Blanchard] / type! / [-]” handwr., red frame. Remounted by M.P.Mier VI.2000 on **5+1 slides**, with 1+1+1+1+1+2 spec.

Notes: I attach the original labels to each of the slides. In slide coll. under HOMII: 1 through 5 and 6 respectively. The name is available from 1922, but the spec. seen were collected in 1929, and cannot be accepted as types.

Specimen labeled as type but probably not intended as a type**Fulgoromorpha**

chilensis [*Taracticus*] (Spinola): Berg 1881: 265–266. **One ♀** Chile: Valdivia, leg. D.C. Anwandter, compared with Spinola’s type in Paris. Type in author’s coll., CB.

One ♀, pinned, “Typus” print. with red ink, red frame; “Valdivia / Anwandter” handwr., red frame; “*Taracticus / chilensis* (Spin.) / Berg”. “*Taracticus / Berg*” and “*chilensis / Spin. / Chile*” handwr., black frame, originally fastened to the bottom of the drawer.
